Q1 Family

Highlight

July 1st - September 30th



Maria's Family

Maria is a single mother of two boys, Emiliano and Leonardo. Maria applied to the Habitat program so she and her sons could grow deep roots and build a stable foundation. Maria is amazed at all Habitat for Humanity does and she is so proud to be a part of the program! Together, Maria and her boys have been a team, looking forward to how a home of their own could teach them self-reliance. Maria is excited for what the future holds and can't wait to see what is ahead for her family. Her home was dedicated in July of 2022.



Q2 Women Build

October 1st - December 31st



DuPage Habitat's Women Build is an event where hundreds of women come together to take action against unaffordable housing through fundraising and volunteerism.

Women, especially those who serve as head of the families and women of color, disproportionately face obstacles that make accessing decent, affordable housing seem impossible. At DuPage Habitat, we know that stable housing is transformative for women and their families. Women Build 2022 had 15 corporate sponsors as well as several community teams participating in fundraising and volunteering. During the 8 day event, the Women Build teams worked on rehabbing two houses in West Chicago for two different families. On the first day of the event, Lisa (a future homeowner in the program at the time) and her children were "offered" a home during the lunch program. This was one of the houses that was being worked on at the Women Build event. Lisa was in tears and was extremely excited to know that this house would soon be her home to purchase. Q2 Veteran Build

October 1st - December 31st



In 2013, Habitat for Humanity launched the Veteran Build program to ensure that the men and women who have served our country could experience safe and stable housing. While the VA reports that veteran households overall have higher employment rates and median incomes than non-veterans, many still face housing problems and inequities as it relates to home ownership. Following the model of Habitat for Humanity's National Veteran Build movement, Chicagoland Habitat's Veteran Build Initiative empowers local military and veteran families to achieve the strength, stability and self-reliance that stable homeownership provides. In November, DuPage Habitat and corporate sponsors Chamberlain Group and Wintrust participated in Veteran Build alongside military veterans and military families. Providing affordable homeownership as well as affordable home repairs for Veteran families continues to be an important focus at DuPage Habitat for Humanity.

Q3 Habitat on the Hill

January 1st - March 31st



February Advocacy

Habitat on the Hill, Habitat's premier legislative conference, annually mobilizes nearly 400 Habitat staff members, board members, homeowners, resident leaders, volunteers and emerging leaders across the country to come together in Washington, D.C. United by a common purpose, participants represent their communities; engage with each other; learn from esteemed experts in housing; and collaboratively strategize to champion policies that drive home affordability at the local, state and federal levels. In February, DuPage Habitat for Humanity coordinated the IL delegation of affiliates advocating on Capitol Hill for affordable housing policies and funding. The affiliate met with Congresswoman Ramirez, Congressman Casten, Congresswoman Kelly's staff, Congressman Jackson's staff, and Senator Durbin's staff. From Habitat on the Hill, the affiliate continues to have strong relationships with these offices.



Q3 International Women's Day

January 1st - March 31st



The Intersection of gender, race, and housing

In March, DuPage Habitat for Humanity partnered with the DuPage Historical Museum and the Wheaton League of Women Voters in celebration of International Women's Day. This event included a panel of local experts from DuPage Housing Authority, Bridge Communities, HOPE Fair Housing, and a DuPage Habitat homeowner to discuss the intersection of gender, race, and housing. International Women's Day serves as the affiliate's kick off point for Women Build.

Michelle's Story

Michelle is a single mother to two boys Karon and Deshon. Michelle had experienced adversity in her early life, she said, "I had to grow up fast and get in survival mode." Michelle started her motherhood journey at 19, and has worked hard in her career to provide the best life possible for her children. She has gone back to school and received additional education in Medical Assisting and has now been at the same job for over 14 years. Michelle has always wanted to be a homeowner, but didn't know where to start. She said, "The older I get, the more I think about my future and having stability and something that I can leave behind for my children and grandchildren. I feel that Habitat is a perfect opportunity for my family so that we can continue to grow, save and have stability and purpose in our lives."



Q4 Repurpose for a Purpose

April 1st - June 30th



The second annual Repurpose for a Purpose event took place in April at the Addison Habitat ReStore. The highlight of the event was a silent auction where individuals were able to bid on one of a kind, hand crafted items originally found in Habitat Restores that were repurposed by local furniture artists and DIYers. There was an increase in the amount of items that were repurposed and auctioned compared to the previous year – which in turn had more people in the community aware of Habitat ReStore and Habitat’s mission. As this event grows each year, more dollars will be raised and more people will be exposed to Habitat for Humanity’s mission of affordable housing.

Lisa heard statements such as “welfare queens” and “women with children in Section 8 housing are lazy and undeserving of aid.” What is most impressive about Lisa is her ability to do what needs to be done, against all odds when it comes to her family. She showed that again with her application to Habitat for Humanity. With the help of Habitat and Lisa’s courageous spirit, a permanent and stable home for her family to thrive became a reality. Lisa’s dream of a decent place to live finally became true.
